Ladge Speech and Hearing Center** serves as a complete diagnostic and therapeutic facility providing speech, language and audiological services for children and adults with communication disorders. Since speaking, hearing and understanding are essential for communication, an impairment in one or more of these areas can be detrimental. A full range of services includes evaluation and treatment of aphasia, articulation/phonological delay, hearing loss, delayed language, learning disabilities, stuttering, and voice disorders.
