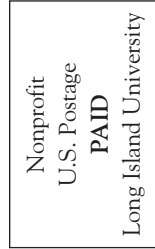

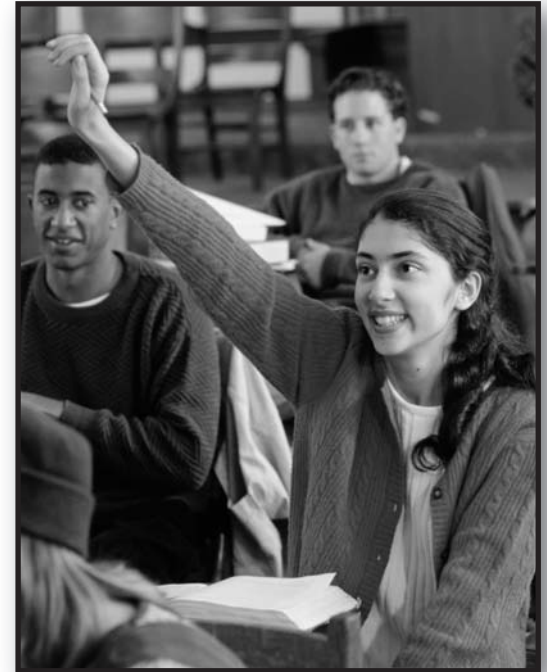

Program for Academic Success (P.A.S.)

The C.W. Post Campus Program for Academic Success, part of the Learning Support Center, was created to assist students who do not qualify for regular acceptance achieve academic success. The goal of this one-year academic program is to help students become matriculated without restriction by providing a reduced course load, smaller class size, support services, and continuous evaluation during the freshman year.

Admission

To be considered for admission into the Program for Academic Success (P.A.S.), students must complete and submit a regular admission application to the Admissions Office, provide an official high school transcript and aptitude test scores: either ACT or SAT-I, a personal statement, and two letters of recommendation. The Admissions Committee will refer appropriate candidates to P.A.S.

Candidates will not be considered unless they possess one of the following:

- a minimum 80 unweighted average or
- a minimum score of 480 verbal or 440 math on the SAT-I.
- equivalent ACT scores

All P.A.S. candidates are required to attend an Information/Interview Session before acceptance can be considered. Admission is based on the student's potential and motivation to succeed in a college environment.

P.A.S. students must be full-time students. Students in the program are admitted to the University on a restricted basis (12 credits per semester) and remain restricted until they exit the Program.

Except for Reading and Interpretation, all Program for Academic Success courses are part of the Core Curriculum required of all C.W. Post students for graduation.

P.A.S. students are required to have a mid-semester evaluation to assess their status in the Program.

****Students who complete the fall semester with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (B) will be allowed to take 15 credits in the spring semester.***

Support Services

- Smaller size classes to provide individual attention
- Faculty taught labs (1 hr. per wk. for each P.A.S. course)
- Academic tutors
- Individual guidance and monitoring by P.A.S. administrators
- P.A.S. advisor to facilitate course registration

Exiting the Program

Students who complete all Program requirements and the P.A.S. curriculum in their first year with a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and with the cumulative grade point average required by their major will automatically exit the Program.

Students who complete their first year with a cumulative grade point average between 3.0 and 2.0 or who do not fulfill the first year requirements will remain in the Program for Academic Success during their second year. These students will choose their own classes from among the University course offerings; however, each semester, they must include two Core courses. Support services will remain available to these students.
